Master Gardeners Create
Beautiful Spaces
Volunteers under direction of the Master

Volunteers under direction of the Master Gardeners spent the first year (2015) at McCoy Farm & Gardens cutting trees, removing invasives and reclaiming garden beds after years of neglect. The next two years were spent obtaining grant money, having a garden design created and then implementing and maintaining the gardens referred to as the "horseshoe gardens" near the pavilion, as well as a "heel-in" bed on the west side of the house.

The results are spectacular and add a beautiful backdrop to weddings, picnics and other events hosted on the property. The Garden Committee is currently in the process of creating a criteria for future gardens that would enhance and emulate those established.

They are also assisting the Board in finding potential businesses that create master plans for properties that are similar in size and usage to McCoy Farm & Gardens. This includes researching public gardens similar in size that are sustainable.
