Kevin Calhoon led another successful bird walk on April 27 at McCoy Farm & Gardens.



The number of people attending was almost equal to the 33 identified species. Of particular interest was a scarlet tanager in full view at the top of a tree, a large flock of cedar waxwings,

Signal Mountain Centennial and the Bachman Family

Signal Mountain continues to celebrate its Centennial year with gusto. The "Firecracker Mile" foot race in Old Town starts at 10 a.m. and leads the 4th of July Parade.

The parade promises to be the biggest and best ever. Everyone is welcome to participate, with a decorated bike, truck, float, antique car, scooter, little red wagon, or your walking shoes. The lineup begins at 9:00 a.m. on Ohio Avenue near the historic Alexian Inn and winds its way along James Boulevard to the picnic pavilion behind the country club.

To watch the parade, find a spot along the route by 10:00 a.m. "BBQ and Bands" follows at the pavilion beginning about 11:00 a.m. Plan to stay for a program and to purchase Centennial memorabilia. Fantastic FIREWORKS will explode over the Shackleford soccer field at dark.

In all the excitement, it is fun to remember that the communities of Fairmount, Sawyer and Summertown were well established by 1919. The Bachman family traveled up the W Road to settle on the mountain about 1912.

Here is what Martha Bachman McCoy had to say in an interview in 1982 "... just as I was growing up, they began to build Signal Mountain....Iremember when they blew the bluff off to make the roads going up there. We started over there in the wagon on an old lumber trail and we got lost. We were floundering around in the woods, and we heard this loud blast. Dad said, 'Well, it's all over with; we might as well go home.' So we all turned around and went back." (from *Walden's Ridge: the early years -* Stone)

The Bachmans were among the "summer" families who came to the mountain in 1875-1878 to escape cholera and yellow fever outbreaks in Chattanooga. They were preceded by folks from Sequatchie who settled the mountain after the Cherokee treaty of 1817. That was more than two centennials ago!
