As you may have observed, there is a grand allée of sweetgum trees along the front drive leading to the Bachman–McCoy home. The existing trees are over 100 years old and unfortunately three were missing. New sweetgums were added in May to replace them.

Sweetgum is one of the valuable forest trees in the southeastern United States, and with its star-shaped leaves, is a popular ornamental tree that displays beautiful fall colors.
