They are researching all available resources and taking care that relevant books, photographs and papers are preserved by scanning before the originals are stored in an effective archival manner. Have You Ever Heard of Scratchmore Apples?

Scratchmore seems to have been the casual and amusing name Senator Bachman selected for his farm and orchard when he was raising apples. Perhaps he was following the custom of the many Walden's Ridge residents who named their homes after qualities – good or bad – of their summer places.

Stephen Mazza, Dean of the University of Kansas Law School, recently donated the apple barrel stencil shown in the accompanying photo. A native of Huntsville, Alabama, he has a historic home in Beersheba Springs, TN. He purchased the stencil from a traveling vendor near Monteagle Assembly. The seller said that he had gone to see Mrs. McCoy at her home, and she had sold it to him – possibly because she and other family members



did not care for the name "Scratchmore" for their homeplace.

When Mazza talked with Susan Snow about the find, he offered to restore it to McCoy Farm & Gardens. We were

thrilled to accept it, and you can see it hanging on the wall in the kitchen.
