# Progress on Infrastructure

Infrastructure may not be an exciting subject to some, but to Charles Adams, Maintenance and Projects Chairman, the subject is something to brag about.

"We continue to make progress with infrastructure improvements. A campaign to upgrade the electrical systems has recently been completed. The Main House, Pavilion, Apple House, Carriage House and Blacksmith Shop now have new electrical systems," he says. The work has eliminated unsafe, outdated wiring, added additional power outlets, and provided outdoor lighting. All new electrical work is now code compliant. The new electrical systems will also permit future conversion of overhead service to an underground feed and eliminate unsightly power poles and lines.

A new site water supply system has been installed replacing the existing 70 year old, failed system. We appreciate the work of WRUD in relocating the water meter to make it all possible. Additionally, recent WRUD pipe line construction in the area has provided a fire hydrant at the main house, on the left at the end of the front drive. Progress indeed!
