New Leaders receive training and guidance from the chairmen; then each leader forms a team and takes responsibility for directing the group in caring for the special area they "adopt." Examples are:

- Adopt a tree or a section of fence row
- Adopt a specific area (e.g. "Sally's orchard" or Emma Bell Miles site) to renovate and care for
- Adopt a section of the Trail to improve and maintain
- Adopt a section (or all) of the driveways
- Remove debris; haul to burn or mulch areas
- Supervise burning
- Load, haul or spread mulch

- Remove invasive growth on and under trees
- Prune dead limbs; cut/clear dangerous larger trees
- Provide and/or drive a truck for loading and hauling
- Clear around and preserve dogwoods, hollies, azaleas, rhododendron, and other desirable growth
- Identify and fill in holes in lawn areas
- Restore, seed, fertilize, and water grass
- Mow grass. Water plants and trees
- Rake and remove leaves, sweet gum balls, twigs, etc.
- Use line weed eaters to keep things trim
- Pull weeds (e.g. from heirloom daffodil beds)
- Help the Master Gardeners in the gardens
- Sweep walks and paths or use leaf blower
- Qualify as a golf cart operator and drive at events
- Put up/take down signs at events; move tables/chairs
- Maintain parking areas; direct parking at events
