Master Plan Announced

Thanks to a generous donation from the Tucker Foundation, Hodgson Douglas Architects of Nashville is completing the Master Plan for McCoy Farm & Gardens. As soon as the booklet is printed, it will be available for inspection at the Walden Town Hall, McCoy Farm & Gardens and on the MFG website at



www.mccoywalden.org The board has worked with Hodgson Douglas since March, 2018, as they considered how to manage growth, maintain existing facilities, organize pedestrian and vehicular circulation, and create strategies for short and long-term land management.

Some of the Plan goals have already been achieved: expansion of parking, renovation of Taft Highway and Anderson Pike entrances, construction of 3-board fencing and repair of the stone wall along Anderson Pike. Now the Master Plan provides a prioritized "Action Plan" for completing even more goals.
